### **1st-2nd Grade:**

This week readers reviewed common text features of nonfiction. They used their knowledge of these features to help them navigate through nonfiction topics of their choice and recorded facts of interest. Students will use these recorded facts to later learn how to write facts in their own words. Mr. K visited our class during science this week to share with us a lava rock from one of the Hawaiian Islands. He shared videos and neat facts about lava flow and how it is related to our science unit of study. Scientists also chose a specific water or land form to study more closely over the next month. Stay tuned for information about an at-home project that will go along with their study.

### **3rd-4th Grade:**

This week students finished learning all the capital and lowercase cursive letters. After break students will be responsible for writing their morning work in cursive. Students are also encouraged to write their homework in cursive, but it is not required. We also began learning the counties of Maine. They were introduced to a song sung to the tune of Yankee Doodle Dandy to help them learn the different county names. You can listen to the
